



EDUCARE FOUNDATION

EduCare Foundation is a US based non-religious, non-profit organization operated solely by volunteers. Its objective is to help in the education of poor, orphan, deaf & mute and handicapped children.

EduCare currently supports 11 schools located in 9 states of India with more than 1000 students helped every year. EduCare has also recently constructed a school for deaf and mute children in India from restricted funds from a generous donor. EduCare has various charity programs:

- **Scholarship Programs:** Cash scholarships are awarded to students to help to pay for school fees, uniforms, books, school materials etc.
- **School Facility Infrastructure Improvements:** Purchase desks & benches, furniture, computers, blackboards, playground equipment etc.; and building improvements and new construction from restricted funds.
- **Orphanage Support:** Provide funds to orphanages for education of orphan children.
- **Qualified Staff:** Provide qualified teachers to needy schools.
- **Computer Education:** Provide scholarship to needy children in USA for computer education.

EduCare also started a scholarship program in United States. With an intention to instill a culture of compassion and giving among our youth, EduCare sponsored essay contests among high school students during 2009-13. In 2012 EduCare started an educational assistance program in a preschool in Piscataway for computer education to needy children. EduCare has also initiated a Youth Leadership Program for High School Students in New Jersey.

Helping needy children for education in India through EduCare Foundation is inexpensive. EduCare volunteers understand the culture and systems in India and so are able to stretch every dollar for maximum benefit going to the children. About \$50 to \$100 supports one child for an entire year depending on the location.

With all volunteer workers, its administrative expenses are limited to stationary, postage, and regulatory fees. All fund raising events and gift items are sponsored by individuals. EduCare Foundation always welcomes suggestions from its partners and supporters.

Our Mission



EduCare Foundation has provided educational assistance to tens of thousands of poor children across India since 1994. It is a non-profit tax exempt charity organization registered in State of New Jersey.

EduCare's work is inspired by **Mahatma Gandhi** "He who servers the poor serves the God", **Mother Teresa** "Love one another, help one another, and be kind to one another", and by **Dr. Martin Luther King** "Everybody can be great because everybody can serve..."

A donation of **\$50** helps to keep **one child** in school for **one year**.

Educare has started a new mission here is **USA** by providing computer education to needy children. A donation of **\$200** provides computer education to **one child** for **one year**.

A message from the President of Educare Foundation, Inc.

The EduCare mission is simple. **It strives to increase literacy among the vulnerable and needy children.** It focuses on retaining such children in schools who are likely to drop out due to grinding poverty and get pushed into child labor because education gets sacrificed first. Even small assistance when set up properly works. It believes that education can change the world. To a child, it gives hope for a better life. When that child becomes an adult, he or she would be better informed.

Since 1994, EduCare has provided assistance to over 20,000 needy children in India. Our assisted schools are located in tribal, rural, urban, and metropolitan areas. They include orphans as well as the children of the victims of Mumbai terror attacks, sex workers and destitute. **We are working with two NGO's to increase programs in tribal areas.** Recently, we have also started assistance programs and youth leadership programs in New Jersey.

A unique feature of today's event is to **bring together our donors, volunteers, and school officials** to share success stories as well as issues to better guide the foundation in its effort. Dignitaries will share their experiences. Another invitee, Shweta Katti will share her story from childhood in Mumbai's red light district to full scholarship in New York's Bard College this fall. We also have a great entertainment program as well as delicious food for the evening.

EduCare Foundation always welcomes suggestions from its partners and supporters to increase literacy in this world. The more hands we can join together to provide books and an access to a teacher for each child, the faster **we can co-create a more progressive and a peaceful world.** Thank you for your support and being with us today.

Keynote Speakers for the evening



Congressman Frank Pallone, Jr. has represented central New Jersey in Congress since 1988. Pallone is a senior member on the House Energy and Commerce Committee and serves as the top Democrat on the Committee's Subcommittee on Health. As Health Subcommittee Chairman during the 111th Congress, Pallone played a leading role in passing the Affordable Care Act. The landmark law extended health care coverage to an additional 32 million Americans and reformed the nation's health care system. Pallone also serves on the Committee's Environment and Economy and the Communications and Technology Subcommittees and is a member of the House Natural Resources Committee.



Mr. Upendra Chivukula, Deputy Speaker of the New Jersey General Assembly, will be the keynote speaker. In 2002, Upendra became the first Asian American to be elected to the New Jersey State Assembly. Due to his hard work and leadership, he has been reelected five times to the Assembly. "Education is the greatest equalizer" Upendra says, as he tells the story of how he used a small lamp to study late into the night during his childhood years. He still remembers that and so last month, he presented more than 350 students with backpacks filled with school supplies to Middlesex County students.



Ms. Shweta Katti, a teenager from Mumbai came to USA this August for education on full scholarship in New York's Bard College. Shweta grew up in Mumbai's red-light district. As a child she dreamed of travelling abroad and getting an education. Her immediate goal is to study psychology, with the plan of helping women who have been traumatized by conditions of sexual abuse. She was recently featured in Newsweek's Women in The World: 25 Under-25 Young Women To Watch.
